WHAT MAKES PPCC SUCH A GREAT CLUB

The following is a story about two PPCC club members. It will demonstrate how the true 'club spirit' sometimes works.

The CORVAIR owner in this story lives away from the metropolitan areas, in a small town. Now we all know how difficult it is to find anyone who will even look at our cars, let alone actually work on them. The car in question hasn't been running quite right for some time, mostly in need of simple tune up, oil change and a loving pat on the fender but the owner simply couldn't find anyone around to do the work and 'petting the fender' only works for a little while if the other stuff isn't done at the same time.

The other club member made a journey to the small town and helped the owner make some of the repairs needed and now the car is running pretty fair, according to the owner.

I have purposely left the names out of this story, I don't think the member doing the work did so for any glory and I don't want him to think he has been volunteered for more in the future. The moral of the story is that the friendship and help that we as club members give to each other is by far the best part of belonging to PPCC.

TECH TIP--CHANGING SEAL BEAM HEAD LIGHT UNITS

Changing head lamps is made difficult due to the fact that the ring around the lamp itself has a spring attached to keep tension on the adjuster screws.

A simple tight hook on the end of about 6" of coat hanger wire is the tool you need. Put the other end in a pair of vise grips and you are ready. After removing the two screws that hold the ring in place, use the hook to grab the end of the spring and pull outward; the ring is loose and the old headlamp can be unplugged. Plug in the new sealed beam and again hook the spring and pull outwards, slip the ring around the lamp and line up the two screw holes.

An added tip: use a screw starter for the two screws, it is much easier than trying to balance a slothead screw on the end of a screwdriver blade.

Another thing to watch for is the deterioration of the plastic headlight aimers. New ones are available from GM or your favorite vendors. They become very brittle over time, you should have some around or at least access to them, otherwise your headlights will not be aimed properly if one or more gets broken.

DID YOU KNOW???

Over 20% of PPCC members own at least one turbocharged CORVAIR?

PROJECT CARS IN PPCC

For the first time in several years more project cars are appearing in the PPCC group than in the past. There seems to be a rejuvenation of 'do-it-yourself' spirit. The CORVAIR is one of the cars just made for fixing/restoring by the owner; the parts have been reproduced and used parts are plentiful too, plus the car lends itself to being 'personalized' since the value of a restored to stock car is not that great.

Mike Wiltrout caught the CORVAIR bug after his parents, Miles and Orita bought and fixed up a 63 monza coupe about 1 1/2 years ago. Miles is still working on the car of course (they are never really finished), he just installed a set of high back recliner bucket seats in the fall of 1999 and the car looks and runs very well. Well, back to son Mike; he found a 1966 140 corsa with a poor engine and has gotten the engine rebuilt and is talking about getting the body and paint finished before the Tri-state in May.

Larry Neal has been dividing his time between the 1964 coupe and the 1965/66 convertible. When there are two car projects going at the same time, the finish rate is divided by 4 according to my sources. Larry is also sitting on a 1963 convertible, a car that he owned years ago and managed to wrangle from his brother.

Jan Patton who lives in Kim, Colorado bought a 1964 monza convertible last year and it resides next to the 1964 spyder coupe that she has owned for several years. The convertible is ready for sunshine, the spyder always needs some attention (as all turbos do). Maybe calling the spyder a project is stretching it a bit but there are a number of areas that she wants to get repaired so she can enjoy the feeling of the 'afterburner'.

Dale Wilshire has been working on a 61 lakewood that he purchased in Colorado Springs and took home to Boulder. He discovered a lot of rust once he got into the fenders and floors but is making progress. He has made patterns of the pieces that he has had to fabricate for the fender areas, willing to share with anyone else who needs them. A turbo engine is in the thinking stage too, he hopes to have the wagon ready for the Tri-state too.

Jim Emerson is doing some detail work to his 62 monza turbo wagon. Jim showed the wagon at the 81 convention in Denver but left many details un-done. He wants to finish this project in time for car shows around the area this spring.

Your editor has made up his mind that the manx buggy will be ready for sunshine this year too. After several years of sitting in a completely dismantled state, a combination of the original buggy and parts from a buggy obtained from Garrie Fox is going back together. The next project is sitting under a carport, the 1966 corsa coupe belonging to Ruth needs a lot of body work and paint. After that project, a V8 is looming, your editor will be busy.

There are many other members with projects, some little and other large and lengthy. Since most of us own several CORVAIRS, just the routine maintainance is a project in itself. In fact, the total CORVAIR count for the families named above is 30 CORVAIRS. There are six member/member families above but two of those names are single people, that is not stopping them from owning more than one CORVAIR.

DON'T LET YOUR CORVAIR SIT ALL WINTER

A lot of us have 'garage babies', cars that only venture out when the sun is shining and the pavement is dry. Usually the car is hidden away in October and doesn't see daylight until April.

There are entire books written on the subject of everything needed to store a car, whether for a week or several months but I doubt that any of us really pay attention to those details, instead we simply drive the car into the garage and close the door.

I have three cars that sit through the winter, what I try to do every month or more often if the weather and time allow is to start each car, let it run for several minutes and then back the car out of the garage and move it around on the driveway or around the block very quickly. This insures that the bearings and seals get some motion in them as well as getting the engine parts and oils up to temps also. It also works the steering and other suspension parts and the brake system. The brakes seem to be one of the parts that doesn't like the non-use, the wheel cylinders will stick. I have even seen the shoes rust to the drums. I never never never use the parking brake because of that, if you have an automatic, use a couple of blocks at one wheel to keep the car from rolling. The powerglide likes to be used occasionally too, it will leak less if it gets some exercise.

I try to make sure that the fuel tank is half full or so when I initially park the car in the fall, during the winter I will drive the car to the gas station and put a little in, it keeps some fresh gas mixed with the older gas.

Another nice part about getting your pampered car out is that the tires get rolled around, you check the air pressure and maybe even treat the car to the hand car wash. Luckily our winter weather gives lots of nice temperatures to still get the cars out once in a while.

I am a firm believer that a car that sits will be more troublesome than a car that is run every day. The seals start to dry up, the carbs dry up, the grease finally runs out of all the bearings in the transmission and the top of the gears in the differential are open to humidity. Granted this takes a while but I think the humidity is higher in the the front range area now compared to 35 or more years ago. I have even seen clutch discs get frozen to the pressure plate and flywheel, a victim of humidity here in Denver.

Going back to the carbs, the oxygenated fuels that we burn in the winter seem to be extremely hard on the fuel system. Anything rubber/neoprene fall prey to the fuels AFTER the fuel is drained away. If a rubber hose stays wet, like the one in the bottom of the tank, it will be pliable, the one over the rear axle will dry out and become brittle over the period of a couple of months. Needless to say, if you run the engine often, the hoses stay wet and pliable. Don't forget too, there are rubber accelerator pumps in the carbs (rubber diaphram in the turbo carbs), these parts are very susceptible to the drying out description that I gave above.

I think that if you start and run your car for a bit it will be ready to give you good service in the spring instead of having to work on it before it will even leave the garage.

BEGINNERS MANUAL

The readers of VIRTUAL VAIRS have put out a call for a publication referred to as the BEGINNERS MANUAL. The authors of each chapter volunteered to write about a given subject, anything from electrical to engine to paint. It was first organized by Hank Kazmerezc and has been taken over by others on VV.

The original plan was to have it finished for Lake Tahoe in 1999 but simply didn't get enough push, now the due date is convention time 2000. The book should be a great help to new owners of the CORVAIR, a welcome addition to the tech guides, shop manuals and other publications.

BEWARE OF POOR QUALITY AXLE BEARINGS

There were several different manufacturers of axle bearings for the early CORVAIRS. Among them were New Departure/Hyatt and BCA/Bower. These are the 'proper' built bearings. There was also a company named 'GREEN BEARING CO'. They built a single row ball bearing assembly to fit the dimensions of the EM bearings HOWEVER, they don't have the movement to align them and they can't be taken apart for lubing. They are easily identified by the shrink ring placed after the bearing to help hold them onto the axle and the fact that the housing will not have any aligning motion. This bearing is good only for a spare. GREEN doesn't built them anymore but they are still seen from time to time. Buy the bearings from the vendors, they are the only ones that will really work on our cars.

Larry Neal walked up to me in Albuquerque several years ago while I was looking at Tom Schrum's red DEVIN C and said "I sure would like to own one of those". One of the negative subjects that I hear at the shop occasionally is that older cars aren't as reliable as newer ones. Now most of us know that age isn't necessarily the only factor in this, it depends on the maintainance and care that the old car has received.

Most of us can do the simple things that will keep our cars in good condition. Things like checking the wiper blades, the amount of washer fluid, lubricating door hinges and latches, all the lights in the car and if the heater/defroster is working.

A good case in point was last Sunday at the brunch. Ruth and | left Denver in the spyder of course, the sky was grey but nothing more. By the time we got inside the Officers Club, snow began to fall. It wasn't a bad snow, a little wettish, but that is spring snow. Now I knew that the heater/defroster worked ok, and the wiper blades are good too but I couldn't remember if I had a snow brush in the car. The spyder hasn't been snowed upon in quite a few years. Tucked under some stuff in the trunk was a trusty snow brush and this brings the moral of this story to mind: Always be prepared for the weather changes in Colorado AND always have your CORVAIR well maintained so you have no worries about venturing out when the possibility of bad weather is near.

I see folks' cars in the shop with tattered heater hoses, blower motors that are so poor that a gopher could blow more hot air through the ducts and oil pouring from the underside. These are the same folks that say that they are selling their old car because it is not reliable.

This spring there will be a lot of us from the Colorado Springs and Denver areas driving to Albuquerque for the Tri-state meet. These will be all very nice cars, both in appearance and in

mechanical condition. We are the lucky ones, we will be able to enjoy our CORVAIRS because we take care of them.

I spend a lot of time writing about checking the tire pressures, looking under the car for leaks and a loose wire hanging down; things like washing your engine, keeping the weatherstrip clean and protected, maintaining the exhaust system and in general keeping your car clean. I even hear occasionally that someone takes the advice and spends some time on their car too.







SPENDING AN ENJOYABLE EVENING WITH CAR PEOPLE

As most of you know, Ruth and I were deeply involved with the dune buggy craze when it hit in the mid sixties. I had the opportunity to build and sell parts for many dune buggies until the fad wore off in the mid seventies.

The name most associated with the dune buggy was BRUCE MEYERS, originator of the MEYERS MANX, TOW'D and MANX SR. Bruce did not completely leave the dune buggy scene after the company went away and several years ago, he and wife Winnie started the MANX OWNERS CLUB. Not exclusive to the MANX, the club recognizes any fiberglass bodied dune buggy and has several hundred members around the world. They have started organizing events throughout the year, tours into Baja, southern California and other places. They even go to Europe for meets, the buggy is very popular there too.

Recently Bruce and Winnie were in Black Forest, staying with a member of the MANX CLUB and that member called several of us close to the area and invited us to his home for the evening of food and chatting with the Meyers'.

For several hours we listened as they told of driving through sand/silt and rocks to arrive at a place that uses diesel generators for electricity therefore only a couple of hours in the morning and nighttime is there lights, sleeping on the sandy beach and just jumping into the surf for cleaning in the morning.

They also told tales of having a buggy stuck at the bottom of a rock slide, nighttime approaching and the efforts to get to the people and the cars. This group stops at night and sleeps on the ground, fixes something to eat in the morning and continues to drive.

They told of driving in the rain in Belgium with no top on the car, trying to hold an umbrella over them while oncoming traffic splashed them repeatedly. THESE FOLKS ARE TOUGH. The group of buggies counts into the teens on most of the tours.

One interesting note was that Bruce said a fellow club member in San Diego owned a BMW/Benz shop and was German through and through but always has insisted that the CORVAIR engine should be used in all dune buggies. He did not like using a VW at all.

The host of the get-together fixed supper for the 7 of us, in fact one MANX club member drove from Salida, another from Boulder. We left after 1:00am for the drive home. Driving home on 83 that early morning, I didn't feel a bit tired. Between trying to maintain a 85mph average on the narrow twisting road and remembering all the enjoyable times that Ruth and I had with our buggies; I finally got to tell Bruce Meyers "THANK YOU" for many years of happy motoring plus adding a large part to my business. It took no time at all to drive home.

INTEREST IN THE CORVAIR IS ON THE INCREASE IN THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA

There seems to be an increase in the interest of the CORVAIR in this area. There are several reasons that I believe this is happening. First is the influx of folks from other areas of the country. Right now in the PPCC ranks we have two member families that have re-located

here. They are Jon & Debbie Anderson from Albuquerque (CNM) and David & Tonya Fasgold from Oklahoma City. The Denver club (RMC) has a couple of new members also that have moved into the area.

The next reason is that the CORVAIR has remained an 'affordable' collectible car. Many of the cars from the 50's and 60's have really jumped in price in the last few years, our favorite car has remained lower priced. This is both good and bad, good if you want to buy; bad if you want to sell. The lower price also hurts a bit when you have to justify putting dollars into the car and knowing full well that you might not get the return on your money.

This brings up the next reason, there are a number of rebuilt/restored/partially restored cars in the Rocky Mountain area for sale. This has become a more attractive way to buy a car, wait until the owner has finished the rebuilding and then buy the car at a lessor price than what the seller has in the car. Again, the lower cost of the CORVAIR tends to feed that a bit. This also tends to reduce the number of project cars in the club. Future owners simply watch for a car and buy it so they can drive it NOW instead of waiting for months while parts keep the UPS driver busy every day.

On the other hand, there are a number of cars being built right now in both the PPCC and RMC. Miles Wiltrout is finishing Orita's white 63, he has the engine rebuilt and the interior is getting along. Son Mike has his 140 CORSA ready to paint and was hoping to have it finished for the TRI-STATE.

Garrie Fox has been working on his 1969 fuel injected coupe and new members Dave and Kay Hopper are getting the mechanicals in shape on their 64 convertible. Grand Junction members Ed and Jean Olwine are getting a 63 blue coupe into good condition and Dale Wilshire has been working on his station wagon. Dale has had to replace a lot of rusty areas and deal with poor body work from the past but he is making progress. He is building a 180 turbo for it also.

TECH TIP

Usually fixing your CORVAIR is easy, it is knowing what to fix that can be difficult. Recently an owner called me with a description of a plugged idle circuit on the left bank. According to him if the engine speed was up the engine ran fine, just didn't want to idle. I suggested that probably the idle circuit was plugged but asked him plainly if the engine was running on all 6 cyl. He assured me that it was. He even called me back the next day to tell me that the car ran fine for a couple of minutes, then started acting up again. I agreed to take a look at it a couple of weeks ago. When I started it I knew instantly that the engine WAS NOT running on 6 cyl. I pulled the plug wires one at a time to isolate the dead cylinder (when you find a plug wire that doesn't change the way the engine runs, that is the culprit. Next I checked the compression and sure enough ZERO. The engine had a valve seat out. To be sure I pulled the valve cover to check the rocker arms. they were all in place. Pulling the head revealed the exhaust seat had been loose for a long time.

Needless to say, the engine couldn't have been running ok at higher rpm, it just seemed to smooth out because of the speed. MORAL: take a compression check first if you suspect something wrong in one cylinder.




MEETING MINUTES

MISC TECH TIPS

If you park your CORVAIR on a level spot overnight, you can check your oil the next morning by simply pulling the dipstick out. No need to wipe it, the oil has settled.

If you like to keep extra differentials around, it is amazing that they retain grease despite being drained, turned upside down, etc. To plug the side seals, use things like old turn signal flashers or caps from engine oil bottles.

It used to be the norm to roll an extra belt into a circle but the belt manufacturers claim that leaving the belt in its' stretched out mode is the best.

For the late model stick shift folks, buy a couple of VW bug heater cable clamps, when the ball comes off the end of your clutch cable, you can install one of the clamps, readjust your clutch and continue down the road.





TECH TIP: RADIO NOISE

The following is from VIRTUAL VAIRS. The response by Larry Forman is very good on a subject that is pretty foreign to most of us. I have his permission for reprinting this.

The question was asked by Joseph Potts: 'I get a "pop" everytime my A/C compressor cycles on. This is in FM reception-I assume it is the same on AM.'.

The response is from Larry Forman: 'As a long time ham radio operator and electronics engineer, I need to comment on this fovorite topic of mine. Radios can pick up noise by only three methods:

- 1-Radiated (through the antenna)
- 2-Conducted (directly through the power leads)
- 3-Induced (inductively or capacitively coupled through the power or antenna leads) This is the least likely for our cars.

To isolate radiated versus conducted, simply unplug the antenna and see if the noise goes down dramatically or completely. To isolate sources of conducted noise, power the radio from a separate battery. Once you know the method the noise is getting into the radio, you can attack ways to prevent the source from getting into the radio.

Noise, at least for compressors turning on and off, is GENERALLY more conducted than radiated, especially on FM, and can be reduced by filters or running the power leads more directly to the car battery. FM, being frequency modulated, is a transmission technique that is designed to eliminate noise pickup since it responds to frequency changes and not amplitude changes,

which noise generally is. AM tends to pick up noise fairly easily. Techniques like grounding hoods can serve to shield radiated noise, so if you see the noise reduced by unplgging the antenna, then you might be on the right track. Techniques like bypass capacitors (condensers if you have lighter hair) may work for conducted noise. Filters are also used to eliminate or reduce conducted noise.

You could spend a lifetime really studying this topic, but this is just scratching the surface.







PPCC MEMBERS ATTEND THE GWFBT&SM

PPCC members Steve and Ruth Goodman attended the Fan Belt Toss/swap meet in Palm Springs this year. The event was the weekend of November 3-5. The weather was cooler than normal and the local weather forecasters had predicted rain for the weekend too, this kept the numbers of attendees and show cars down.

It did not rain but the temps were just barely 70 in the mid-day and breezy and it cooled down quickly at night. Ruth and I journeyed to Jim Craig's home in Joshua Tree before the toss started and the usual Ultra Van group were not there either. Most had foregone the trip, the weather across the entire southwestern part of the US was not too friendly.

There were several from RMC who attended also including Harlan Colburn and Loralee Pollack, Harlan Jr and Terry and daughter Andrea, Bob and Lora Attwood, John and Claire Hoffman and Christy Barden.

The closest thing to a CORVAIR by anyone from the Rocky Mountain area was the CORVAIR powered baja bug dragged behind our Winnebago.

The cars that were at the show were excellent as usual, the California cars are always so clean because of the mild weather there. The VV group held a very short meeting on Saturday and then the V8 group went to a pizza parlor for lunch. 34 members of the V8 group attended, there is a great interest in putting more power in the CORVAIR.

MIRACLE PRODUCTIONS took a video of the meet, it will undoubtedly debut in the 2001 year.

KEEP YOUR CORVAIR GOING...AND GOING...

For quite a few years now I have been writing tech articles for the DRIPLINE as well as the DENVAIR NEWS. Unfortunately most of the failures I write about are prompted by what happens in my shop from month to month. Since this is my last writing effort I would like to summarize the failures that I have found through the years.

MAINTAINANCE: The CORVAIR was supposed to be a cheap compact car but by its' very design it is in need of constant maintainance just like aircraft engines and high bred foreign cars. The engine has 54 seals, gaskets and o-rings and many fine crafted pieces of sheet metal that must be in place to aid in the cooling. The suspension must have perfect balance of tires/shocks/alignment and even tire pressures. Without this balance the car loses its' appeal quickly. It is also this high degree of maintainance that caused a lack of interest with many mechanics. It has always been difficult to find a shop that is really ready to work on a CORVAIR.

As part of the maintainance program there should be a regular checking of fluids. The transaxles of the CORVAIR are particularly sensitive to oil leaks and when the grease levels are low, the bearings and gears are quickly destroyed. Along with fluid checks are lube schedules, the front suspension pieces will last a very long time if greased regularly. When these suspension parts wear, the independent suspension design of the CORVAIR will feel very bad, even on a smooth road. WATCH YOUR TIRE PRESSURES. If your CORVAIR starts to wander on the roads or follow ruts, the air pressure is the first suspect. A difference of at least 12 lbs between front and rear is necessary. Also the CORVAIR demands good radial tires for the best feel on the road.

Also while on the topic of fluids, we'll talk about oil. In an aircooled engine, the oil does double duty, both lubricating and helping to cool the engine. Oil quickly fouled when used for short trips and warm up time is limited, oil changes should be more frequent than with other engines. Even if you chose synthetic oils, they become as contaminated with moisture and fuel residue as regular oil, don't fall for the advertising gimmicks of not having to change your oil for many thousands of miles.

CLEANLINESS: Even though it is a part of maintainance, cleaning your 30+ year old CORVAIR is the key to having the car around in the years to come. Everything from constant washing of the salts on the road in the winter to keeping dirt and oil from soiling the engine bay needs to be done on a regular basis. When I stated the double duty of oil above, the cooling is aided by the heat transfer from the inside of the engine through the aluminum to be blown out by the cooling fan. If the engine is dirty, the air can't pass through the cooling fins and the heat is trapped inside the engine because the dirt acts like a blanket.

I always suggest using the hand held car wash systems and spend lots of time under the wheel wells and under the floor of the car. Wash the front suspension thoroughly in the winter time too and remember that when you drive in rain water or snow/slush, the front suspension gets water into the joints easily. A quick grease job will get that water out of the tie rod ends etc.

DRIVING HABITS: If you get in a habit of letting your engine idle for a minute or two before shutting it off, especially in the summer time, the heat in the engine is stabilized. The oil is cooler and the risk for dropped valve seats is lessened. Keeping the engine rpm up and not lugging will also keep the heat low. Listen to your car, if the starter all of a sudden sounds different, something is making it sound different. Don't wait until the car lets you down, realize that something is starting to fail. If most failures are caught before the part actually is ruined, the price of repair is less.

IN CLOSING: most of the failures that I see at the shop are due to virtually forcing the part to work until it completely gives up. Wheel bearings could have been packed earlier instead of continued use of the car until the bearing is seized. Then a tow bill is added to the repair price. The examples like that are many. Naturally with the age of the car, many of the parts are getting worn because of old age too. Again however, the part can be rebuilt before it fails completely and is ruined.
