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
Orita L. Wiltrout passed away on December 27, 2002 after battling with brain cancer for 8 1/2 months.

The 2003 Tri-State Meet will not be held at the Raton Holiday Classic as originally planned.

Hurley recently stayed there three nights on a business trip. It was decided that the motel and their restaurant did not meet the standards that a Corvair enthusiast would expect. The meet is still on, however, and is scheduled for May 30 and 31, 2003.

While Hurley was in Raton he checked out other places. It was decided to use the Microtel Motel at 1640 Cedar Street as the host motel. Their rates are \$44.95 plus tax for a room with two queen size beds and \$53.95 plus tax for a suite which consists of a room with one queen size bed, a kitchenette and a couch that makes into a double bed. When you make reservations mention the Corvair Meet to get these rates. The phone number is 505-445-9100.

Two alternate motels are recommended: the Super-8 at 610 Cedar Street, 505-445-2355 and the Motel-6 at 1600 Cedar Street, 505-445-2777. There is also an RV park available in Raton: Summerlan RV Park at 1900 South Cedar, phone 505-445-9536. I do not have 2003 room rates from any of these yet.

The banquet will be held at Domingo's at 1903 South Cedar. They will offer three entrees in the \$13 to \$14 price range. More details to follow.

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

This is the time of year that I pull out my slow cooker at least twice a week. Here are some slow cooker recipes that you can toss into the slow cooker in the morning and have a great dinner in the evening with a simple salad and some bread. I sometimes get the bread machine going also and it smells wonderful walking into the house at the end of a long day.

Bloody Mary Chicken

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves 1 - 33.8 oz bottle Blood Mary mix (I use extra spicy)

Wash, skin and remove fat from chicken breasts and place in slow cooker.

Pour Bloody Mary mix over the chicken breasts, turn slow cooker to low and cook on low for 8 hours.
Serves 4.

Easy Beef Stew

3 lbs chuck roast, cut into bitesize cubes 1 pkg. dry onion soup mix 1 - 12 oz can or bottle of ginger ale 1 - 8 oz can mushrooms, drained

Mix all ingredients in a slow cooker. Cook on low for 8 hours. Serves 6 - 8.

Easy Slow Cooked Chicken

8 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
4 potatoes, cubed
1 - 10.75 oz can condensed cream of mushroom soup
1 - 10.75 oz can milk (use soup can to measure)
1 T cornstarch
1 pkg. dry onion soup mix

Put chicken pieces and potatoes into slow cooker. Combine the

soup, milk, cornstarch and dry soup mix and pour over the chicken and potatoes. Cook on low for 8 to 10 hours. Serves 4 - 6.

Sour Cream Butter Biscuits

1 c flour
1/2 t salt
1 c baking powder
1 c butter, at room temperature
1 c sour cream

Preheat the oven to 400°. Mix the dry ingredients together (2 cups of self-rising flour can be used in place of the flour, salt and baking powder but I never have any). Mix in the butter; add the sour cream and blend well. Place spoonfuls of the batter in greased miniature muffin pans. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown.

Makes about 3 dozen.

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
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



I had an error in the recipe for Sour Cream Butter Biscuits. The corrected recipe follows:

Sour Cream Butter Biscuits

1 c flour 1/2 t salt

1 T baking powder

1 c butter, at room temperature

1 c sour cream

Preheat the oven to 400°. Mix the dry ingredients together (2 cups of self-rising flour can be used in place of the flour, salt and baking powder but I never have any). Mix in the butter; add the sour cream and blend well. Place spoonfuls of the batter in greased miniature muffin pans. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes

or until golden brown.

Makes about 3 dozen.

For the balance of the recipes, I think I'll stick with a 'bread' theme.

Cheesy Herb Bread

1/2 cup butter or margarine, softened

1 (.7 ounce) envelope GOOD SEASONS Italian Salad Dressing Mix

1 1/2 cups shredded Mozzarella Cheese

1 loaf French bread, cut in half lengthwise

Mix butter, salad dressing mix and cheese until well blended. Spread onto cut surfaces of bread. Place on cookie sheet. Broil 3 to 5 minutes or until cheese mixture is bubbly. Cut into slices.

Strawberry Nut Bread

3 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking

Pikes Peak Corvair Club

soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

3 teaspoons ground cinnamon

2 cups white sugar

2 cups sliced fresh strawberries

4 eggs

1 1/4 cups vegetable oil

1 cup chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease 2 - 9x5 inch loaf pans. Mix together the flour, baking soda, salt, ground cinnamon and sugar in a large mixing bowl. Make a well in the center. Beat together the eggs and oil and pour them into the well. Stir just enough to moisten the ingredients. Fold in the strawberries and nuts. Pour mixture into prepared pans; fill containers no more than half full. Bake in a preheated oven about 60 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool 20 to 30 minutes before removing from pans. Move to a rack to cool completely before slicing.

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

On a happier note, the March meeting will be at the Golden Corral on Powers Blvd. and details are located elsewhere in the Drip Line.


I hope that you have made your reservations for the hotels in Raton for the Tri State Corvair Meet in May. I made mine last week when I returned from the services and they still had rooms at the

Notes from Your Editors Dennis & Debbie Pleau

The Pleau Family attended the February Brunch/Meeting at the Air Force Academy's Officers Club. We had a great turn out as we have had for the last few brunch/meetings.

On the Corvair front, I went to start my 65 daily driver on Friday the 7th when it was 5 below, and couldn't get it started. It would turn over but would not fire. I gave it a quick shot of starter fluid and it still didn't start. I went back in put on a pot of coffee and called my boss when he got in and told him I would be working from home. I didn't think much about it not wanting to fire on gas as it is hard to get it to vaporize at -5 but I thought it was strange, it didn't fire on starting fluid. I justified it to myself by thinking I had only given it a real small squirt as I hate the detonation when a engine runs on it. Sunday afternoon, I again tried to start it and it still wouldn't start, so I gave it another quick shot of starter fluid and still nothing. I decided I had an ignition problem, because if it had any spark at all it would have lit off the ether.

The car has a Delta MK 10 capacitive discharge ignition, which was one of the have to have ignition upgrades in the 60's. It has a switch on it to bypass the CD unit and just use the points (in my car the points have been replaced by a Pertronics electronic points replacement set up). I pushed the switch and the car fired right up. It looks like this late 60's electronic unit only lasted 35 years.

I don't really know if this unit is much better than the stock system or the Pertronics unit, but I do know its worth about 50 to 75 rpm at idle, just having this unit engaged. It's and easy test because of the switch on the box. Just push the switch and its engaged, push the switch again and it's bypassed and hear the engines speed up or slow down depending on which position the switch is in and read the tach.

Jim Pittman of Corvairs of New Mexico, saw the unit on my car one day and informed me you could by the kit from Heathkit, to build this unit yourself and in fact he had built three of them. He gave me one of his manuals, a few years ago, so I should be able to repair this one. In the mean time I bid on a couple on EBay, the first one I bid on went for over the \$50.00 I was willing to pay, but I bought the next up for auction for \$9.95.





Life has been real busy lately and just haven't had time to go through my recipes. I lieu of some of my recipes, I thought I'd send out some of the recipes that were incorporated into the cookbook that was published for the 1996 CORSA International Convention held in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Cheez Whiz Dip

8 oz cream cheese1 c mayonnaise8 oz Cheez Whiz2 T dry onion soup mix1 t Worchestershire sauce

Mix all ingredients and serve.

Frozen Fruit Salad

1 (20 oz) can pineapple chunks, undrained
1 (10 oz) pkg. Frozen strawberries, thawed and undrained
3 large bananas
1 (6 oz) can frozen orange juice, thawed
1 (12 oz) can 7-Up (can be sugar free)
3/4 c sugar

Combine all ingredients. Stir well. Pour into a 9-inch square container and freeze. Thaw 1 to 1 1/2 hours in refrigerator before serving. Cut into squares. Serves 9.

Green Chile Stew

1 lb ground beef or port
1 lb chopped green chile (fresh
or frozen is best)
1 small onion, chopped
1 to 3 cloves garlic, minced
1 t salt
1/2 t pepper
2 t parsley
1/2 t cumin
1/2 t oregano
1 can cream of chicken soup,
diluted by about 1/2 can water,
or use a can of chicken broth if
you prefer a lighter

and lower calorie dish

Brown ground beef/pork. Add and wilt chopped onion and garlic. Add all the remaining ingredients, saving the chile until last. Cooke over medium heat about 15 to 20 minutes, until the flavors have mixed. Use this chile over beans, enchiladas or other New Mexican dishes. For a hearty stew, use cubed beef or port instead of ground and add cubed potatoes and maybe some cut carrots. Serve with warmed tortillas or sopapillas for a hearty meal. Serves 4 to 8, depending on recipe. Cooking time is about 30 minutes.

Praline Grahams

1 pkg. Graham crackers (1/3 box) 3/4 c butter 1/2 c sugar 1 c pecans, chopped

Separate crackers and spread side by side on a cookie sheet. Melt butter. Mix in sugar and pecans. Bring to a boil. Cook for 3 minutes, stirring often. Pour over crackers and bake at 300 degrees for 12 minutes.

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


Notes from Your Editors Dennis & Debbie Pleau



Windshield Wiper Switch Repair

Dennis Pleau

The windshield wipers on my '65 Monza became unreliable a couple of months ago. I needed to wiggle the knob more and more every time I wanted to use them. The washer became totally unusable, Although this switch was never designed to be repairable, it can be fixed relatively easily. I disassembled and cleaned the switch and it is now as good as new. Although the switch is to the best of my knowledge original, it showed no signs of wear internally. The procedure is as follows.

Remove the wiper fuse or disconnect the battery. Remove the knob by loosening the set screw on the bottom of the knob and pulling off the knob. Remove the switch by unscrewing the nut and pushing the switch out the back of the dash. Pull both wiring connectors off the switch.

Lightly clamp the switch in a vise with the connector end up. Don't overtighten and distort the threads. Using a hammer and a dull punch, straighten the three crimps which hold the Bakelite bottom of the switch to the metal housing.

Slowly remove the bottom, paying close attention to the position of the internal parts. Inside you will find a flat piece of brass with a few bumps on it. Polish the bumps. I used a buffing wheel; very fine sandpaper (600 or finer) should also work. The objective is just to clean the part, not to grind anything away. Polish the copper and brass bumps on the Bakelite bottom.

If you have a windshield washer, make sure to polish the two contacts in the center of the button and the brass stem which comes through from the windshield washer button.

Reassemble the switch. Do not force anything. All the parts in the switch are keyed and will fit only one way. Hold the housing with the threaded end down. Insert the shaft through the housing and rotate it until it drops down as far as it will go, If you have a windshield washer, place the tapered spring around the shaft with the narrow end down. Place the straight spring ov6f the ears. Place the flat brass contact on the fiberboard piece; the brass goes on the back side. Align the ears with the proper slot. Insert this assembly on top of the springs and line up with the ears. Align the tab and replace the Bakelite bottom. Bend the crimp tabs back over the bottom.

Reconnect the wiring connectors. Remount the switch. Note that the switch provides the ground path for the windshield wiper and washer. It must be tightly mounted against clean metal on the dashboard. Replace the knob. Replace the fuse or reconnect the battery. All done! (4/96)

Note: I originally wrote this to the CNM Enchanted Corvair Newsletter. It was picked up by CORSA and ran in the April 96 Communique and then in the Tech Guide supplement.

This is an awesome appetizer...

Cheese Bread

1 8-oz pkg cream cheese, softened

2 c sour cream

1 lb extra sharp cheddar cheese, grated

1 bunch green onions, chopped (including most of the green part)

6 to 12 cloves garlic, minced 3 cans artichoke hearts, finely chopped

1 lg round sourdough bread Olive oil to sauté the onions

Sauté onions in a medium-sized pan with olive oil. Add garlic. Cut cream cheese into eight pieces and stir into the cooked onions and garlic. Remove from

heat. Combine sour cream, cheese and artichokes in a large bowl. Stir in to the onion mixture. Mix well. Cut a large circle in the top of the sourdough bread. Remove all the innards to make a bowl (about 1/4-inch thick). Fill the loaf with the cheese mixture and put top of bread over the filling. Wrap the loaf in two large pieces of aluminum which crisscrosses. Bake for 2 1/2 hours at 350 degrees. Serve with slices of freedom bread or crackers. (Note the politically correct term...)

One of my favorite soups...

Mushroom-Onion Soup

2 lbs fresh mushrooms
1 lg onion, thinly sliced
1 clove garlic, minced
1/4 c butter, melted
2 T tomato paste
8 cups chicken broth
1/4 c Parmesan cheese, grated
1 c dry white wine
1/4 t pepper

Sauté mushrooms, onion and garlic in butter in a heavy 4-quart saucepan until onion is

tender. Stir in tomato paste; simmer about 1 minute. Add broth, cheese, wine and pepper; simmer 1 hour. Serve with croutons and additional Parmesan cheese.

Makes 10 to 12 servings.

This is a really easy dessert...

Dump Cake

1 lg can crushed pineapple with juice

1 can blueberry pie filling 1 pkg yellow cake mix

1 stick margarine, melted

In a 13x9 pan, dump the blueberry pie filling and spread over bottom. Spread the pineapple of the pie filling. Sprinkle the dry cake mix over the pineapple. Drizzle the melted margarine over all. Bake one hour at 350 degrees.

This is great warm with vanilla ice cream. You also can use other types of pie filling but I happen to like blueberry best.

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
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


on photo paper, so either send me a picture or drive your car to an event and I may take a picture and use it.

THE HISTORY OF THE TRI-STATE CORVAIR MEET

In 1976 the CORSA national convention location was Philadelphia, Pa. Since 1976 was also the birthday of the USA, held in Philadelphia also in July, it was not looked upon with favor with many in the western part of the country. The CORVAIR clubs in Denver, Albuquerque and Salt Lake City decided to find a central location and get together a little earlier in the year when temperatures were milder and prices were less. Montrose, Colorado was chosen and a driving event was to Ouray and the Ouray Falls. We also did a car show and the Saturday night banquet was held at Mary's Restaurant. At the time in 1976, this meet was viewed as a one time affair.

Fast forward 10 years; Albuquerque wanted to revive the gathering with the suggestion that the host responsibilities be rotated in the same manner that the GWFBT&SM is done in Palm Springs. It was also a requirement that the event be a 'low key' car meet with none of the tensions associated with the larger car events.

Albuquerque again used Montrose as the centralized meeting spot. Sadly the Bonneville club did not have any members in attendance. The next year (1987) RMC (Denver) hosted in Ouray, Colo. Even though there were no Bonneville club members again, the new club; Pikes Peak Corvair Club (C/Springs) had a number of members in attendance. In fact the interest was so great with PPCC that the next year they hosted and chose Canon City, Co. That would be 1988.

In 1989, CNM chose the ski resort town of Red River, NM. This was among the most picturesque of all the towns we have visited. In 1990 RMC picked Durango and a ride on the narrow gauge railroad. 1991 was PPCCs turn and the town of Gunnison was chosen. CNM picked Las Vegas (not Nevada) in 1992 and then Alamosa was the choice of RMC in '93.

Pagosa Springs, Colorado was the site picked by PPCC in 1994, the Pagosa Lodge had a great scenic view of a lake from the restaurant each morning. Red River, NM was so well enjoyed by all the first time around that it was chosen for a repeat in 1995. It was hosted by CNM.

1996 was the anniversary year for the meet, RMC chose the original location of Montrose for the celebration. PPCC wanted to use Crestted Butte in 1997

but couldn't work out arrangments with the lodge and so chose nearby Gunnison again. A poker run took everyone to Crestted Butte for the afternoon. CNM found a town with lots of history for 1998, Lake City, Colorado. The scenery during the drive into the area as well as just around town was spectacular.

1999 was RMC's turn and Salida was the choice. SLC had expressed interest in hosting a site in 2000 but a turn of events changed that. CNM knew that 2000 was the year of a large car show in Albuquerque that also was recognizing the CORVAIR marque and it was quickly decided that the order be changed and CNM would host. A large picnic was staged on Saturday evening by CNM in a park and there was a large number of CORVAIRS in the show on Sunday.

Many of the attendees each year expressed an interest in seeing the area around Colorado Springs so PPCC chose Manitou Springs for 2001. RMC ventured to the western slope for 2002 and held the meet in Grand Junction. A drive around the canyon was the highlight of the weekend.

This brings us to 2003 and Raton, New Mexico; hosted by CNM. The average attendance is 100-120 CORVAIR enthusiasts and their families. Even though the meet has been hosted all these years by 3 clubs in two states, the name 'TRI-STATE CORVAIR MEET' still holds. Through the years, members from lowa, Oklahoma, Arizona, California, Wyoming and Washington State have attended. There are two families that have a perfect attendance record; Steve and Rita Gongora from Albuquerque and Steve and Ruth Goodman from Denver. Each year the club with the most members in attendance is recognized with an inscription on a traveling trophy.

In addition to that, the St. Francis of Corvair award for the person or family that most perpetuates the CORVAIR hobby was started in Lake City by CNM. This was to honor Francis Boyston who was the 'mover' of the Tri-State meet. Jim Pitman was the first honoree in Lake City, the next year Tarmo and Kay Sutt were named and the following year in Albuquerque, Sylvan Zuercher was recognized. In Manitou Springs the award was given to Steve and Ruth Goodman. Steve and Rita Gongora were the recipients in Grand Junction and on Saturday evening May 31, 2003 we will all know who the newest addition will be.

Plan to attend, the weekend is always very enjoyable.

John Glusick announced that the Abbey Car Show was also on May 17th and is limited to 500 cars. If you're interested, contact Walter Hundertmark for flyers.


Michael Wiltrout announced that he's selling the Ralph Nader stickers for \$5.00 each. A sign-up sheet was sent around for those interested in purchasing one.



Tech Tip from the CORSA Tech Guide

Cleaning Door Hinges

Orville Eliason

Most of the real dirt in the door hinges and the door hold-open mechanism is attracted by the lubricants. If you don't lube them they will squeak and sound terrible and, worse yet, the door hold-open mechanism will wear out and break. They eventually break anyway on some models, but they will last a lot longer if they are lubed.

The only way to go is to clean them when they get looking bad and then relube them. How many of us have looked into this area and said, "this reminds me of the smile of a beautiful girl with bad teeth." Here is a ten minute way to improve the smile of your concours queen with very little effort. Take a

clean oil drain pan and pour a small amount of diesel fuel in the bottom. Set the pan on the ground directly under the hinge area. Dip a brush (a regular parts brush works well) into the fuel and brush the greasy areas. Dip often so the excess fuel will tend to wash away the dissolved grease and allow it to drip back down into the pan. In no time at all the formerly filthy area will be like new. Now remove your pan and gently spray into the area with your garden hose for a final rinse. It's so easy that you will wonder why you haven't kept that area cleaner over the years. One more thing: relube everything so the cycle can start over again. (8/88)

One of the boy's requirements for their 4H Candy Project is to enter a candy into the Festival of Events. Adults can participate also so I entered a quick bread, fudge, brownie and cookie and I received the Baker of the Day award. I thought I'd pass along three of the recipes.

Raspberry Truffle Brownies
(I received a blue ribbon for these)

Brownie Layer: 2 eggs, beaten ½ c butter, melted 2 oz unsweetened chocolate, melted 1 c sugar

½ c flour ½ t vanilla

Truffle Filling:

1 c semi-sweet chocolate chips 8 oz cream cheese, softened 1/4 c confectioner's sugar 1/3 c raspberry jam

Glaze:

1/4 c semi-sweet chocolate chips 1 t vegetable shortening

Combine all 'Brownie Layer' ingredients except for flout. Beat well. Blend in flour. Pour into a greased 9-inch square pan. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes. Cool. For Truffle Filling: Melt chocolate chips and set aside. Beat cream cheese until fluffy, then add sugar and jam. Beat until fluffy. Beat in melted chocolate until well blended. Spread on cooled brownie layer. Glaze: Melt chocolate chips and shortening together. Spread over truffle layer. Chill at least 1 to 2 hours. Cut into small squares.

<u>Cinnamon Bread</u> (I received a blue ribbon for this)

4 c flour 2 t baking soda 1 t salt

½ c vegetable oil 2 ½ c sugar, divided 2 c buttermilk

2 eggs

1 T ground cinnamon

In a large mixing bowl, combine flour, baking soda and salt. In a

small bowl, combine oit and 1 ½ cups sugar. Add buttermilk and eggs; mix well. Stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fill two greased 8x4 loaf pans about one-third full. Combine cinnamon and remaining sugar; sprinkle half over the batter. Top with remaining batter and cinnamon-sugar mixture. Swirl batter with a knife. Bake at 350° for 45-55 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool in pans for 10 minutes before removing to a wire rack.

<u>Chocolate Cheese Fudge</u> (I received a red ribbon for this)

1 lb Velveeta cheese, cubed

4 lbs confectioner's sugar

1 lb butter

1 t vanilla extract

1 c cocoa

2 c chopped nuts, optional

Lightly spray the bottom of a 13x9 pan with nonstick spray. Over medium heat, in a saucepan, melt cheese and butter together, stirring constantly until smooth. Remove from heat. Add vanilla and nuts. In a large bowl, sift together sugar and cocoa. Pour cheese mixture in sugar-cocoa mixture, stirring until completely mixed. Press mixture evenly and firmly into pan. Once hardened, cut into squares.

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

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

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
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June Dripline Thoughts







Tech Tip from the CORSA Tech Guide

No-Mess Oil Change

Prior to next oil change, set aside an empty bread wrapper and a couple of empty two-liter soda bottles with lids. When oil change time comes, slip the bread wrapper under and around the filter before you loosen it. With the edges up around the filter when you loosen it, all the mess goes in the wrapper. Simply tie a knot in the bread wrapper to keep the mess in. The soda bottles, of course, do the same for the oil from the crankcase.

Speaking of used oil in soda bottles, the three-liter bottles will hold all twelve pushrods and tubes from an engine. Add some used oil for long term storage, or solvent for cleaning. A second large mouth bottle will hold all the bolts, nuts, and washers during a teardown. Add appropriate liquid to suit your timetable. For storage, add a piece of masking tape to serve as a label to identify contents.

After cleaning for storage, bolts put in zip-lock bags with a squirt of silicone spray will stay nice looking much longer. The zip-lock bag will also hold an identification slip of paper. (1/87)

This month I thought I'd share the recipes I made for our Memorial Day dinner...

Jalapeno Chicken

6 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, pounded to 1/4-inch thickness

1 (16 oz) bottle Italian dressing 3 fresh jalapeno peppers, halve lengthwise and seeded 1 (3 oz) pkg cream cheese, softened 6 slices bacon Toothpicks

Marinate chicken breasts in the Italian dressing for at least 2 hours (I let is sit overnight). Stuff each jalapeno half with cream cheese. Wrap jalapeno halves with marinated chicken breasts. Wrap each chicken breast with a slice of ba-

con. Secure with toothpicks.

Arrange wrapped chicken breasts on a prepared grill. Turning often, cook 20 minutes or until chicken is no longer pink and juices run clear.

Note: I used a whole jalapeno in each chicken breast. I added a nice flavor but not a lot of heat. My picky son even asked for seconds.

Broccoli Salad

6 c broccoli flowerets in bitesized pieces

Additional ingredients, if desired:
Red onion, chopped
Grated cheese
Bacon bits
Sunflower seeds

Dressing: 1 c mayonnaise 2 T white vinegar 1/4 c sugar

Put the broccoli and any additional ingredients in a mediumsized bowl.

Combine the mayonnaise, vine-

gar and sugar; mixing well.
Pour over broccoli mixture; mix well.

Refrigerated until ready to serve.

Best to make a couple hours in advance to let the flavors blend.

Corn Casserole

1/2 c butter, melted

1 c sour cream

2 T sugar

1 (16 oz) can corn, drained

1 (16 oz) can creamed corn

2 eggs

1 box Jiffy cornbread mix

Mix all ingredients together. Pour into a greased 13x9 pan.

Bake at 350° for 35-40 minutes.

Note: When it was done, it looked more like cornbread but you really needed a fork to eat it.

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


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July Dripline Thoughts

Maggie's 65 Monza Sports Sedan







This month I thought I'd share the recipes for several marinades that I've recently made. I buy meat in bulk and when I get home I break it down to meal-sized quantities in zip-loc freezer bags with the marinade and freeze. Then when I defrost, the meat is marinating at the same time.

Marinade #1

1 c vegetable oil

1/2 c soy sauce
1/4 c red wine vinegar
1/4 c lemon juice
3 T Worcestershire sauce
1T black pepper
2 T Dijon-style prepared mustard
1/2 c dried chopped onion

In a medium bowl, combine all

2 cloves garlic, minced

ingredients and mix well. Pour over meat in zip-lock bag and freeze until ready to use.

This was enough for about 3-4 pounds of tri-tip steaks.

Haven't actually had this one yet...probably this weekend.

Marinade #2

1/4 c cider vinegar3 T prepared mustard3 cloves garlic, minced2 T lemon juice1/2 c brown sugar

1 1/2 t salt 6 T olive oil

Black pepper to taste

In a medium bowl, combine all ingredients and mix well. Pour over chicken in zip-lock bag and freeze until ready to use.

This was enough for 6 chicken boneless chicken breasts.

This was really good.

Marinade #3

1/4 soy sauce 3 T honey

2 T white vinegar 1/2 T garlic powder 1/2 T ground ginger 3/4 c vegetable oil 1/4 c dried minced onions 1 t black pepper.

In a medium bowl, combine all ingredients and mix well. Pour over chicken in zip-lock bag and freeze until ready to use.

This was enough for 6 chicken boneless chicken breasts.

This was really good.

Marinade #4

1 c tequila
1 c Worcestershire sauce
1 c teriyaki sauce
1 T diced jalapeno
1/4 t black pepper
1/4 t salt
In a medium bowl, combine all ingredients and mix well. Pour over meat in zip-lock bag and freeze until ready to use.

This was enough for about 3-4 pounds of tri-tip steaks.

We're having this one tonight.

Hope to see all PPCC members in Cripple Creek next year!!!









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





As I acquired a few new cookbooks while in Pennsylvania, I thought I'd share a few of the recipes that sound pretty good to me (although I haven't had time since our return to try any).

Cinnamon Applesauce Salad

3/4 c red cinnamon candies
1 c hot water
1 (3 oz) pkg red raspberry gelatin
1 1/2 c applesauce
1 (8 oz) pkg cream cheese, softened
1/2 c mayonnaise
1/2 c celery, chopped

Add cinnamon candies to hot water. Bring to a boil and stirring to dissolve. Pour over gelatin, stirring unitl the gelatin is dissolved. Add applesauce and blend well. Pour

half of this mixture into mold that has been rubbed with mayonnaise and chill to set. Mix together the softened cream cheese, mayonnaise and celery; mix well. Spread over the set gelatin mixture. Pour remaining gelatin mixture on top and chill until set. Unmold to serve.

Makes 8-10 servings.

Dairyland Casserole

8 oz noodles
1 1/2 lb ground beef
2 c tomato sauce
1/8 t Worchestershire sauce
1/3 c onion, chopped
1 T green pepper, chopped
8 oz cream cheese
1 c cottage cheese
1/2 sour cream
3 T melted butter

Cook noodles until tender.
Drain and set aside. Brown
beef. Add tomato sauce, Worchestershire sauce, onion and
pepper. Combine cheeses and
sour cream. Butter large casserole. Pour in half of the noodles.
Add cheese and cream mixture
and cover with remaining noodles. Top with beef mixture.
Drizzle butter over top. Bake at

350° for 30-45 minutes.

Rhubarb-Strawberry Pie





So far on our 66 I've had to change the plugs to get it to pass the smog test and replaced the pittman arm bushing so it doesn't wander all over the road. I still have a few more things I need to do, the rubber strips between the side windows are hard and cracked so they whistle. The brakes pull a little bit and something seems loose in the suspension

I also learned the gas gauge is still about 1/2 of a needle width above the empty mark when the tank is completely empty. l

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We now have a little more than 3000 miles on it and it looks like it will be a good reliable car.

We hope to see all of you at the Picnic, we're looking forward to being there. See the calendar of events for details on making reservations. Even with the pull Ben has at the Academy, he won't be able to get you in if your name is not on the list.

tates. The second Sunday of October is the 12th, which is the day before Columbus Day for those of you with a three-day weekend.





Tech Tips from the CORSA Tech Guide

Seat Belt Tips


With the addition of a baby seat to our list of standard car equipment, it has become necessary to add seat belts in the rear of many of our old cars. Here's some tips on seat belts that might help you.

Belts for driver and passenger plus two rear seat passen-gers were standard equipment for 1966; '67 and newer models had belts for all possible occupants (three rear, two or three front, depending on bench or bucket seats.) 1962-65 models have the mounting holes already in the body for driver and passenger. You'll have to drill holes in the floorpan for '60-61 front, or '60-65 rear belts. Locations for drilling have been published in recent *Communiques*. (Note: be sure to look on the back side of the panel before you drill; wiring harnesses, brake lines, heater cables, etc. are nearby!)

Most new seat belts sold today come in standard lengths; 60, 72 and 90 inches are common. Corvair cars work well with the 60" variety both front and rear. Corvair trucks are a bit trickier, as the outboard front seat belt mounting holes are close to the seat; the inboard holes are over a foot away. The 60" is a bit short, the 72" a bit long. The solution is to buy one of each, and use the long belt parts on the inside and the short parts on the outside. A center front seat belt installation in an FC would probably need the 90" version.

Of course, if you came across some original NOS belts, the '60-65 rear seat type and the '60-62 front seat type were adjustable in effective length, as were period aftermarket belts. There are a few seat belt restoration companies out there too, and they'll restore an original type belt to any length you want. A restored belt can be big bucks (\$75 per person and up, way up!); I've been pleased with the ones offered by J.C. Whitney (W & Co. to us) that have a chromed lift release handle. They're very '60s looking and are less than \$25 each. They also offer pushbutton release style belts at similar prices, if that's what you prefer.

For rear seat installation, a little trick I do is to alternate the belt arrangement; that is, buckle, latch, buckle, latch, rather than place both buckles on the inboard and both latch parts on the outboard (or visa versa). With this arrangement, two rear seat passengers can buckle up in a normal fashion, one on each side. The baby seat can then, with no passengers in back, be buckled in the center of the rear seat, without the addition of a third center belt. Perhaps you carry three passengers in the rear and need a center belt anyway, but for us, at least now, two will do nicely and helps avoid a "belt jungle." (2/96)





There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:45am.











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





brand and Firestone had

\$15.00 tires and one of their mid line tires. I put on the Firestone mid grade tires and so far I like them. They are a lot quieter than the tires which were on the car and the car doesn't wander around near as much. The best thing is how much better they hold the road than the tires that they replaced. There is a couple of turns on Hodgen Road I drive through every day, they are posted at 25 mph, I've taken Debbie's van through at 55 many times, I even took my 65 coupe through at 70 once (A Honda was riding my bumper and I decided I wasn't going to lift as I was sure, I could make it through and stay in my lane after the second turn, the Honda was way behind me). What is Ackerman and Why Does Your Corvair Have It?

The Ackerman effect is based on the fact that as a car turns a comer, the inside wheel scribes an arc of a smaller radius than the outside wheel (by an amount somewhat less than the track width of the front wheels).

In order to account for that fact, an "ackerman" correction rotates the inside wheel further than the outside wheel -- based on the same steering wheel movement in a turn. This allows the inside wheel to trace a smaller arc without fighting the road.


There are several factors which are designed into the system to create this effect. The front-to-rear offset of the steering cross shaft vs. the steering arm tip, the length and inward vs. outward location of the arms. Any of which can be changed by a willing race car builder.

All stock Corvairs have the proper amount of ackerman designed in (however much that is!). But when you change the relationship between the steering cross shaft and the point that it intersects the wheel mount, all bets are off. (Think goofy aftermarket steering arms.) In a true racing application, ackerman is not a big deal, because the inside wheel at the front isn't doing anything to speak of during competition. It is just along for the ride. I have lifted a front wheel several inches off the ground on an Autocross course on a late model. I don't think the air minds which way the wheel is passing through. Even if the wheel is touching the ground, it isn't working very hard.


The primary reason for keeping ackerman is to provide quiet turning and longer tire wear on regular street cars.



80106

Beef & Dumpling Bake

2 lbs round steak, cut into 1inch cubes 2 medium onions, sliced 1 bay leaf 1 can cream of mushroom quos 1 can French onion soup

1 4-oz can mushrooms 1 T Worcestershire sauce 1/3 c flour

1 10-oz pkg frozen peas

Place steak in 13 x 9-inch pan. Cover with onion slices. Add bay leaf. Combine soups, mushrooms. Worcestershire sauce and flour. Pour over meat and onions. Cover and bake at 350° for 2 hours. Place peas on top of casserole. Drop dumplings on top of peas by teaspoonful. Cover and bake 15 minutes longer. Uncover and bake 10 minutes or until the dumplings are browned.

Dumplings:

1 egg 2 T minced parsley 1 c flour 2 T cooking oil 1/4 t sage 1 1/2 t baking powder 1/2 t salt

Combine egg, milk, parsley, sage and oil. Combine flour baking powder and slat and add to egg misture. Stir only until dry particles are moistened.

Enchilada Bake

2 lbs ground beef 1 medium onion, chopped 2 cloves garlic, chopped 2 to 4 T chili powder 1 t leaf oregano 1 1/2 t salt 1/2 c flour 3 c water 1 dozen corn tortillas 1 c sliced black olives 2 c grated Cheddar cheese

In large skillet, brown beef, onions and garlic; drain well. Mix together flour, chili powder, oregano and salt. Mix well. Add to beef mixture: mix well. Add water. Simmer 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Place 4 tortillas in an ungreased 9 x 13-inch pan (you'll need to cut them some to cover entire bottom). Cover with 1/3 of beef mixture. Top with 1/3 of olives and 1/2 cup of cheese. Repeat twice more, using 1 cup of cheese for top layer. Bake at 300° for 30 minutes or until heated through.

Kielbasa Casserole

1/2 t garlic powder

6 c frozen hashbrowns 1 c sour cream 2 cans cream of potato soup 1 soup can milk 2 c cheese, shredded 1 lb kielbasa, cubed 1 t onion powder

Put hashbrowns in large mixing bowl. In another bowl, combine remaining ingredients; mix well. Pour over hashbrowns; mix well. Place in 9 x 13-inch pan. Bake at 350° for one hour or until heated through.

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



We bought the 66 Sports Sedan at the end of June and we have now put a little over 7,000 miles on it. The odometer doesn't work, so I've been multiplying the gallons of gas by 24 and using that as the mileage. My 65 140 got 23 mpg commuting to work, so I just arbitrarily assigned 24 to the 110. This may not be exact, but it's close enough to know when to change the oil. I enter the gallons and price into a spreadsheet on my lap top and it tells me I need and oil change at 125 gallons.

Speaking of changing oil, AC-Delco has discontinued the PF4 filter which fits the Corvair. While Fram and Puroilator make filters, a lot of us are/were partial to the AC filter. When I heard this news. I ran down to Advanced Auto where in July I bought five filters they special ordered for me. I was going to buy all the filters they had in their warehouse. Someone beat me to it as they had none. The good news is

and is the same as the WIX 51038 as well as the NAPA filter. The bad news is WIX has no dealers in Colorado Springs (dealers in Pueblo and Denver metro area) and if you can't get a wholesale price from NAPA the filter is about \$12.00. For you anal retentive types, there is a guy on the Virtual Vairs mail list who is applying with General Motors for the rights to make a stick on vinyl decal that will look just like the current printing on the PF4. He will sell these decals with a small can of the proper color spray pant. You take a WIX filter. paint it, stick on the decal and viola, you have a PF4.

From what I heard, Purolator has fixed the design problem with their filters. When they changed their design a year or so ago, one of the gaskets blocked the oil flow into the filters, people were complaining about installing a new filter, driving 3000 miles and then finding the filter only 1/2 full of oil. None of the oil went through the filter, it all went through the bypass.

I for one sure enjoyed the Aspen tour. PPCC should really think about doing few driving events every year instead of just this one. As a lot of

Broccoli Rice Casserole



I need to pull the door panels and adjust the windows to get better sealing.

One of the other upgrades I made this month was converting to a standalone electric windshield washer pump from the original pump which is integrated with the windshield wiper motor. I have, in the past, repaired the original pumps, but find them only marginally acceptable when they are functioning properly. centrifugal pumps, pump a lot more fluid with out pulsing like the original. The big thanks of the month goes to Garrie Fox. One morning on my way into work, I heard a bearing start to make noise. It sounded like a blower bearing which usually will whine a while before failing. I emailed Garrie from work and asked to borrow his blower bearing greasing. We hope to see you at tool. I know after a bearing starts whining. it's going to fail, but pumping it full of grease will usually give a little more time (hundreds of

miles not thousands) so I could get a new bearing from one of the suppliers. When I got to Garrie's we talked about the blower bearing options, replaceable vs. the original type. We then went out and started the car and realized it was the alternator bearing, not the blower bearing. No problem Garrie just happened to have a set of alternator bearings. Since I had 25 miles to go, he also insisted I take his spare alternator. The alternator bearings completely gave out about 12 miles from home. I installed Garrie's spare alternator on the side of Woodmen Road and was then able to get home. I've torn apart my original alternator and removed the bearings, the brushes are about 1/2 worn out, so I ordered a new set from the Underground (the closest set NAPA had was Atlanta). I took a few pictures and will write up the rebuild in the next issue although the 65 shop manual covers it very well.

ED OLWINE, LONG TIME RMC/PPCC MEMBER PASSES AWAY

Ed Olwine passed away on October 25 peacefully at his home in Grand Junction, Colo. He was born on November 23, 1937 in Dayton, Ohio. He was married to Jean Blessing on August 27, 1960.

His love of cars began with a hot-rodded 1950 Mercury. Dictated by everything in Ed's life, the car was fast but quiet. His first Corvair was a 1961 Monza coupe, purchased new in Denver. He drove that car for 6 years, until an untimely wreck on icy roads took the car away. He bought his white 1964 4 dr sedan in the early 1980s. Ed added the maroon 1963 coupe, another 1963 coupe, a 1963 coupe that was passed on to son David, a 1967 and a 60,000 mile 1960 sedan.

Ed's main interest in driving the Corvairs was 'touring'. His proudest moment was participating in the 100th anniversary of the automobile in Detroit with the VMCCA (Veteran Motor Car Club of America). His was the only Corvair in attendance. He also enjoyed all the friendships and experiences he gained while touring in one of his Corvairs.

Two sentences that sum up Ed's character were part of the eulogy by son Jim: "A doting grandfather, he was a world-class spoiler who was never too busy to bait a hook or make a milk shake. Dad always wanted to help people, I can't ever remember a time when he wasn't looking for a way to help anybody that was in need".

Ed is survived by his wife Jean, sister Nancy Olwine Byme, son Jim and wife Lisa and their two children Maria and Evan and son David and wife Brenna.

Ed gave much of his time and expertise to help RMC when the Tri-state Corvair meet was held in Grand Junction in 2002. He will be missed by all car enthusiasts.

Pikes Peak Corvair Club

Replacing a mechanical windshield wiper washer pump with an electric pump.


Corvair windshield washer pumps, if your Corvair is even equipped, are getting very old. Some or most Corvairs didn't even come from the factory with windshield washers. This tech tip covers switching a Corvair which already has a windshield washer to a modern electric pump. I've made this conversion on two Corvairs and know a few other people who have also done similar conversions.

Before I get into how to modify vour car. I must mention, some parts are still available to fix the original system. Anco makes (or did until recently) replacement pumps which include the diaphragms and valve assemblies. The valve assemblies are avail- First a suitable mounting location able from most Corvair vendors and most parts houses.

My personal opinion, is even when the factory original pumps are working as the General intended, they are marginal at best. so unless you want your car to remain stock, you may want to

consider this modification.

The pump I selected is sold under the Roberk brand and came




installed in my '65 was sold under the Trico brand and came from RepBoys Both pumps are identical. Not all parts which come with the kit will be used and a couple of electrical spade terminals will be required which don't come with the kit.

must be found. The only requirement is that the pump should be mounted near the reservoir. On both my cars that I've installed an the motor. electric pump on, finding the location was easy as a previous owner had drilled a hole near the washer reservoir for some unknown reason. While the pumps are not mounted in the same location, they function the same.

Screw the pump down. Remove the hose that goes from the cap of the reservoir and toss it. Using the hose which came with the kit? connect the barb fitting on the teservoir cap to the inlet to the pump (center most connection), leave enough slack so the cap can be removed for filling without having to disconnect the hose. Remove the two smaller hoses from the original wiper pump and connect them using the tee which came with the kit. Connect the center connection of the tee to the output of the pump.

Pull the electrical connector off the existing pump. Route the wires from the new pump to the connector and cut them to length. from Advanced Auto. The pump I Crimp an insulated spade terminal to the ends of each wire. Plug the spades into the connector which was removed from the wiper pump. At least in 1966 the white wire from the new pump goes to the blue wire to the old pump and the black goes to the vellow wire. These new electric pumps will spin backwards, so it is necessary to connect the wires correctly. Also since the switch on a Corvair provides the ground, you can't just ground one side of



This picture is on the almost completed installation on my 66 sedan. After the picture was taken, I wrapped the electrical connector with electrical tape, routed the wires under the hoses and routed the hose from the cap to the pump in front of the hoses to the nozzies.

After the pump is installed, plumbed and wired, if done correctly, you will find the window washers now squirt somewhere about the middle of the roof. They can easily be bent down using a medium sized screwdriver through the cowl vent to hit the middle to upper part of the windshield. Left and right adjustments can also be made at his time.





Marinated Flank Steak

1/4 c honey 1/4 c soy sauce

1/2 c red wine

1 clove garlic, chopped

1/2 t rosemary, crushed

1/2 t chili powder

1/2 t black pepper

1 lb flank steak

In a medium-sized bowl, mix together all the ingredients except the flank steak. Pour mixture into a Ziploc bag and add the steak. Place in refrigerator and let marinate for 24 hours, turning every now and then. Prepare your grill. When ready, grill on high heat for 7 minutes on each side for medium rare. Let stand for 10 minutes before slicing very thing against the grain.

Italian-Style Pork Tenderloin

3 1/2 lb pork tenderloin 2 cloves garlic, minced 15 oil cured black olives, pitted and chopped 1 t prepared mustard

Salt and pepper to taste 3 green chile peppers, halved, deseeded and sliced 4 fresh mushrooms, sliced 1 onion, thinly sliced 1 T browning sauce

Slice the pork tenderloin open the long way. Spread the mustard, minced garlic and chopped olives in the roast. Sprinkle with salt and pepper all over, to taste. Tie the loin at 1-inch intervals to shape evenly into a roll. Refrigerate for 24 hours.

Prepare the grill. Using a generous amount of heavy duty foil, lay the slices of red 1/2 lb medium-sized shrimp pepper on the bottom. Put the marinated tenderloin on top. Paint the lin with browning sauce and place the onions and mushrooms on top. Seal the foil, making a little tent on top.

Grill the roast for about 30 minutes or until it has reached an internal temperature of 160°. Let sit for 10 minutes before carving.

Tipsy Chicken

6 c water 2 c beer 1/8 c salt

1 t garlic powder

1 t onion powder

3 lb chicken

2 T ground cumin

2 T curry powder

2 T chili powder

1 T pepper

1 t salt

1/2 t paprika

1/2 t cayenne pepper

Combine water, beer, 1/8 c salt, garlic powder and onion powder in a large container, mixing well. Add chicken and marinate for at least an hour. Discard marinade.

In a small bowl, combine remaining ingredients. Rub mixture all over chicken. Grill.

Saucy Shrimp

1/4 c Kikkoman Teriyaki Baste & Glaze 2 T dry sherry 1 T lime juice 1 T sliced green onion

3 drops hot pepper sauce

Shell, de-vein and butterfly shrimp. Combine remaining ingredients and mix well. Add shrimp, coating well. Cover and refrigerate for one hour.

Remove shrimp from marinade and place on rack of broiler pan. Broil 2 to 3 minutes or until done. Serve immediately.


