Steve and I had a great location and we had a pretty cool day. John was registered for the show, but was recovering from Covid and sadly couldn't make it.



Tech Tips - make your own tools!

Dad was born 100 years ago this year. Grandfather Fox was born in 1884. Both of them instructed us and provided the simplest approaches to Maintenance and repairs on our personal and the family vehicles.

There was one of these in Dad's toolbox and in the early to mid 1950s, I saw it used to pull a pilot bushing. That was before Corvairs Debuted on 2 October, 1959, but we ended up using this multiple times to replace our Crankshaft Pilot bushings, even in Corvairs.

Dad started us young with our own toolbox and one of these is the first homemade solution put in my box. It cost zero.



A hex head bolt, washer and square carriage nut were found in the spares and put together to be my forever tool. The Square 9/16th nut is narrowed on opposing flats to less than a half inch so that it may be inserted through and behind the pilot bushing. A reused washer with a hole smaller than the bolt head is placed on the bolt after the nut is in place and before the is bolt started into the threads of the nut..

A socket or wrench is used to turn the bolt head and doing so pulls the nut up on the bolt while the bolt's tip bears on the blind hole bottom. It pulls the bushing out without any mess at all.

I have seen hilarious methods to accomplish the same goal using Grease, Bread, Slide Hammer, but this is the simplest and cleanest approach!
