As many of you will know, Kristal and I are heading back to Australia this December (flying out on the 21<sup>st</sup>), so this will be my final words as




President. It is perhaps appropriate that this message reaches you the week of thanksgiving, as I have much to be thankful for being part of the club, and for the past year President.
