



Jim thanked Bettie Jo and Ben for setting up the brunch.



## Tax examples are meaningless

The letter on April 19 regarding the taxes due on various incomes was so grossly inaccurate that I feel I must respond.

The letter compared the 1986 and 1987 taxes on taxable income to try to prove that 1987 taxes are higher. What it doesn't point out is that the taxable income is computed differently in 1987 and therefore his examples are completely meaningless.

To make a fair comparison, one must start with adjusted gross income. To give a simple example, please consider a married couple with a salary of \$15,000. Let's assume that they did not itemize deductions. In 1986, their tax would be computed as follows: \$15,000 less personal exemptions of \$2,160 equals \$12,840. The tax on \$12,840 was \$1,168. This is from the tax table which allowed a "standard deduction" of \$3,670. This would be an effective overall tax rate of 7.8 percent on the \$15,000 salary.

The 1987 tax on a salary of \$15,000 would be computed as follows: \$15,000 less personal exemptions of \$3,800 and a standard deduction of \$3,760 for a taxable income of \$7,440. The tax on this would be \$994 for an overall effective rate of 6.6 percent.


This is a reduction of taxes in the amount of \$174 for the married couple in this basic example.






### Don't Fill Your Tank To The Brim

Do you try to "fill 'er up" to even money at the gas pump, causing the automatic nozzle to shut off several times before you're satisfied the tank is full? Break the habit, urges the Car Care Council. Overfilling can waste fuel and cause engine problems as well. Further, it pollutes the air.

The reason is that raw gasoline at the top of the tank enters a tube leading to a vapor recovery container under the hood. The charcoal filled canister is supposed to send gas vapors to the engine where they are burned off, but the raw gas creates an over-rich mixture and causes poor combustion in the engine. The result: poor gas mileage, rough running and possibly hard starting. You may also notice a gas odor in the car.

Unburned hydrocarbons from auto exhaust, a major cause of air pollution, have been reduced by 96% since 1960. The

biggest source of trouble from the tail pipe now is due to maintenance neglect: a dirty air filter, worn spark plugs, incorrect timing or general lack of tune up. But other sources of hydrocarbon vapors, such as fuel evaporation when filling the vehicle, continue to plague us.

Corrective measures are being taken. In some states, for example, service stations must have special nozzles and hoses to capture these vapors and return them to the underground tanks. An expensive proposition, but effective. There's talk of incorporating sealed systems on future vehicles, whereby the vapors cannot escape during the refueling process.

For now, however, vigilance is the answer.

And, of course, keep the engine in good mechanical condition. An added caution for motorists with respiratory ailments: avoid gasoline fumes. They are especially irritating to sensitive lungs. Spend the little bit extra for full service.

# What's to do in Red River!

## Fishing

Red River offers some of the finest Trout fishing in this part of the country. There are several stores in town that can help you get set up and let you know where the fish are biting. (No license required for children 11 and under. One day license: \$8.50; 5 day:\$15; season:\$25.50).

## Hiking

Where? Anywhere. You can get a trail map at the Chamber and go on your own hiking adventure--take a picnic, it'll be fun.

## Jeep Riding

Whether you want to 4-wheel it on your own or get a personal tour, there are several jeep rental/tour places in town that will provide you with the means to see old gold mines, high country and scenery that'll take your breath away.

## Ski Lift Ride

If you'd like a bird's eye view of the beauty of Red River, take a ride on the ski lift. Used to carry thousands of skiers up the mountain in the winter, this summer ride provides incredible views of the town of Red River, the ski area itself, and the mountain peaks in the area. Ride up and eat lunch. Then, work it off by following "the nature trail". (\$5/adult, \$3/child).

## Off-Road Vehicles

Whether you like 2-wheelers, 3-wheelers or 4 wheelers, there are several businesses in town that rent the vehicles and can tell you the best places to ride them.

## River Rafting

The Rio Grande is just waiting for you. If your speed's a sunset dinner float or a full day run, there's an outfitter in town and in Taos who can help you make that river trip. (brochures at Chamber).

## U-Haul

Always a popular favorite year after year, Red River has plenty of horses to ride. Short trips or all-day fishing expeditions are available. (\$7/8 per hour).

## Shopping

Some of the best shopping anywhere is right here in Red River-- clothing, specialty items, unique gifts, souvenirs--the shopping search ends right here.

## Dining

Whether you're dying for a mouth-watering steak or just a delicious homestyle dinner, you can satisfy your appetite. They say the food tastes better at high altitudes, and we've got the restaurants to prove it. If you just want to skip dinner and head straight for dessert, you can find ice cream, funnel cakes, and homemade pie at various places around town.

## Fun for Kids

Between the Black Mountain Playhouse and Stage Coach Willys, there's enough good, clean fun to keep your kids entertained for days. The Playhouse has video games, pool go-carts, roller skating, etc. Stage Coach Willys has video games and pool and on several nights during the week, they have a hot game of Bingo going on.

## Dancing

Square, round or just a good, old-fashioned two-step. The Red River Community House hosts square and round dancing almost every night of the week (7PM) (Monday nights, they show a movie for the whole family). You can also dance up a storm at several of the area night clubs.

## Entertainment

If it's musical entertainment you're in the mood for, you're in luck. The Red River Jubilee (Bluegrass) runs Tuesdays and Saturdays at the Red River Theater at 8 PM (\$5/adults, \$3/students, no alcohol). Red River has several night clubs that host excellent local and guest entertainment (country, progressive country and occassional rock & roll). Just ask someone at the Chamber who's playing where on a given night. If you like movies, the Red River Theater shows currently released films on Thursday, Friday, Sunday and Monday nights in July and August. How would you like to see a good, old-fashioned melodrama? The Red River Melodrama plays to sold-out crowds every Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday nights in July & August at the Red River Inn. Had enough entertainment? Well, don't miss a Red River tradition--The Shoot Out at Frye's Old Town every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 4 pm, July & August--it's great fun.

## Tennis

Red River has some beautiful scenery to play tennis by--just go up Mallette Rd. to find the municipal courts (not to mention Mallette Park). By the summer of '87, Red River should be coming right along on their very own municipal golf course--it'll be great.

## Vital Statistics

In addition to the old mining camps that can be seen on jeep trips, Red River has several historical sites. Red River and the surrounding area have almost 50 different kinds of wild flowers. Almost that many species of birds are native to the area. If you're lucky, you might spot some wild animals, like beaver, chipmunk, squirrel, deer, elk, rabbit. If you're not so lucky, you may see black bear, coyote, and skunk. Red River's altitude is 8,750 feet (nearby Wheeler Peak is the highest peak in New Mexico at 13, 161 feet). Average summer temperature is 75 degrees/day, 38 degrees/night; average winter temp. is 40 degrees/day, -12 degrees/night. Yearly average snowfall: 155 inches.

## Church

Sunday services--nondenominational: Community House, 10:30 AM; Faith Mountain Fellowship, Ski Chalet, 11 AM; Catholic, Our Lady of the Woods, 5 PM; Episcopalian, Our Lady of the Woods, 4 PM.

# TECH TIPS

Hey, Mister! You've got a tail light not burning! How many times have you heard this when driving your late model Corvair? One of the most irritating problems with the tail lights is keeping the bulb contacts clean and tightly seated. Some Corvair owners resort to putting a ground wire on the socket and housing to assure good contact. While this works most of the time, it's a bother to do. Others will fashion a small hook and try to lift up the contacts at the bottom of the socket. This, too, may work. But it does not solve the problem. The problem is caused by the inner shell of the socket (the one that holds the bulb) moving slightly out of the plastic outer shell. When this happens, two things occur. First, electrical contact is lost between the bulb contacts and the curved contacts at the bottom of the socket. Just as important, ground contact is lost between the inner shell and the lens housing. The fix is simple. Push, or firmly reseat, the inner socket by pushing it into the outer shell as far as it will go, and then put a drop of epoxy cement on the inner/outer shell to keep it from creeping back out again.



Push the metal inner sleeve down, so that the top of it is flush with the shoulder of the plastic outer socket.

Then, put a drop of epoxy on the place where they touch, thus preventing the inner sleeve from working out again.



When this inner sleeve moves out, proper contact between the bulb pins is lost, and the ground contact between the inner sleeve and the lens housing is lost. If the socket is pushed back into place, there is no need to spread the ground contact.

This method of repair avoids having to splice the electrical leads.







## Low bids leave car buffs cold at classic auction

Alfred Van Dam, a farmer from Alberta, Canada, wasn't too happy to learn he sold his 1931 Franklin at a bargain-basement price to one of the largest casino operators in northern Nevada.

He worked three long years on the shiny green roadster, with the trunk on the back and the wide, long fenders in front.

"So it goes to a casino owner?" Van Dam said, still in shock after selling his dream car. "He's got a good eye for a bargain."

Only buyers who brought no cars along to sell were pleased at the second annual classic car auction conducted by Kruse International at Reno-Sparks Convention Center this weekend.

About 200 of 275 cars at the sale were sold, with a total sales price of just more than \$900,000, said Dean Kruse, national sales manager. The rest were withheld because the bids were too low.

"I would say it's one of the smallest sales we've ever had but I don't know if I like the word slow," said Kruse.

But he blames his own staff for scheduling the sale just after Kruse's annual sale in Auburn, Ind., where a record \$40 million worth of cars were sold in early September.

Kruse, however, said he will continue to hold an annual auction in Reno and expects many more qualified buyers to attend after the new Harrah's Automobile Museum opens at Mill and Lake streets late next summer. About \$15,000, the bare minimum for using Harrah's name for the sale, will go to the William F. Harrah Automobile Foundation from this year's sale, he said.


Van Dam, 41, said he sold his car as a last resort and will use the money to start a new career.

"Know anything about farming the past few years? I've had three bad years, but I've got too much money tied up in this car. I've got to get my priorities straight. It's a toy."

He sold the roadster for \$30,350 — almost \$8,000 less than the minimum price he hoped to fetch — to Richard Kudrna, chairman of Harvey's Resort Hotel at Stateline.

For Kudrna, the car will be another in his 13-car collection he stores in his 2,400-square-foot carpeted garage in Gardnerville.

And it means another addition to the wardrobe of his wife, Vera Lou, who says she already has two closets full of antique clothes. "Everytime we buy a new car I get to go out and get the ward-

robe that goes with it."

But Kudrna, like almost everyone at the show, also lost. He sold a 1939 Willys Overland for \$4,600, a car he purchased for much more from the Harrah's Automobile Collection. And he sold a 1933 Continental Beacon, restored by Bill Harrah, for \$3,500. He paid \$6,500 for that.

Kalim Hakim, of Milwaukee, Wis., brought a gem-studded car owned briefly by Muhammad Ali to the show from Chicago and also was disappointed. He was looking for at least a \$350,000 bid for the 1959 Mercedes-Benz, covered with gold-painted Islamic sayings. He turned down a \$100,000 bid.

"It's a crummy show," said Jack Sneider, who owns two local hotel giftshops, after snapping up a 1974 Cadillac parade convertible for \$1,600 but before two of his cars hit the auction block.

He said he saw cars go for half the price at a show earlier this year at Imperial Palace in Las Vegas.

A 1946 Ford pickup sold for \$2,100; a 1959 salmon-on-white Ford went for \$3,400; the same model in blue went for \$2,300. A supersport, bright red 1965 Chevy Impala went for \$1,500.

The lowest price was \$675 for a 1956 Lincoln Premiere, which had sat in a barn for 20 years. "They didn't even wine the dust off it," Kruse said.

# Avoiding Corvair horn failure

A reoccurring and rather annoying problem with the '60-'63 model Corvairs has always been premature horn failure. I recall that during the three years we had our '61 sedan, (purchased new) twice the horns had to be replaced due to failure. Owners of late model Corvairs are probably puzzled by now — horn failure on these cars is practically non-existent — so why are the early 'Vairs so soundless?

Although horn design has changed little over the years, location certainly has. '60-'63 Corvairs had their horns bolted to the body just ahead of the front wheels. "500" models used only one horn on the left side. All others used dual horns, one on each side. A sheet metal splash shield is riveted to the headlamp bucket on top, and bolted to the bumper bracket extension at the bottom. Besides being somewhat difficult to remove, the shield is also minimally effective, as it does not seal very well at its edges. This lets all kinds of

water, dirt, salt, and general debris seep into the horn, eventually leading to its demise. Obviously, when placed in front of the wheel, the horn goes through a veritable flood of road splash anytime the pavement is wet.

In 1964, among other improvements, Chevrolet sought to put an end to the silent horn syndrome. Without externally visible changes or costly underbody retooling, a satisfactory remedy was implemented. Horns on this year's models would fill the small cavity between the frame rail and trunk floor, just ahead of the steering box and idler arm, respectively. The bumper extension bracket bolt provided a convenient mounting facility — again without costly changes. The new location on '64's finally gave the horns a drier home without loss of decible range.

Next time you lay on the horn button and just get a click from the relay, don't do a bogus repair by attaching some horns in the trunk — they won't get wet there, but they also will not be heard very

far either. Except for those who have a concours stock 'Vair, relocating the horns to the '64 position should be a serious consideration in terms of their service life. The bumper bracket bolts are already there — you'll just need one  $\frac{3}{8} \times 16$  nut per side to thread onto the exposed end of the bolt, thusly retaining the horn. Also, the wires to the horns must be lengthened to reach their new location. When installing the replacement horns, be sure to position or bend the mounting brackets so the bottom of the horn is not lower than the front end panel, otherwise, you will catch it on a parking curb.

As a last note (no pun intended) about horns, be sure to replace the one you remove with one of the same pitch or the tone quality will suffer. Warshawsky (J.C. Whitney) has a very nice matched set of universal replacement horns that come with several adjustable mounting brackets for about \$20. If mail order isn't your thing, check with your local parts store for a similar package.

# Diagnosing oil leak problems

This is the most common malady on the Corvair engine and is usually cured by gasket (oilpan, rocker cover, engine top cover) and O-ring replacement. I recommend the foam gasket sold by Felpco and others because their construction allows for the differential thermal expansion of the aluminum versus steel parts of the Corvair engine, e.g. standard oil pan and rocker covers. These seal for a long period if they are not overtightened. Also a good grade of Viton O-Ring will allow a one-time replacement of these seals. I have seen 65,000 miles, leak free, with a set

installed in 1967.

Other sources of leakage to look for, once the above is taken care of, are: 1) engine top cover; 2) oil cooler seals; 3) oil filter housing to engine rear housing gasket; 4) oil filter gaskets; and 5) crankshaft seals.

Oil leaking out of all of these seal areas may be aggravated by excessive engine internal pressure (blow-by) caused by blockage of the engine vent tube in the engine top cover. Heat soak on shutdown can turn the residual oil in this tube into a hard carbon-like formation which eventually can restrict the tube. High levels of internal

pressure are normally exhibited by leakage out of the top of the oil dip stick tube and the oil filter.

Engine oil smoke in the exhaust (oil by the rings) is also sometimes due to high internal pressure.

Blockage of the vent tube can be checked by running the engine with the oil fill cap off and watching the amount of exiting vapors. When the vent tube is blocked where it goes into the air cleaner, these vapors exiting the fill tube should decrease if the vent tube is open and functional. Also, air blown down this tube (with the engine off!) should produce an air flow out from the oil fill tube.

# Replacing a stock Corvair jack

Recently, I had the experience of a stock Corvair jack breaking apart while I was jacking up a late model to change a flat tire. This jack is good enough to be used for a door stop, but not for raising a car. Any original jack is about to give up, since they usually have been used beyond usefulness. Changing a flat tire can occur frequently, and this situation can become dangerous. I have found two alternatives to this problem. If you wish to retain the original scissor type jack, then one out of a late model Chrysler is larger, a little more stable, and are included in Cordobas and LeBarons. Another alternative and one that I feel is the safest, is to acquire the jack assembly type used in '81-'82 Chevelles. I'm sure that other G.M. body styles will have that type of jack, however I know the Chevelle has one for sure. This jack uses the scissor type method of jacking the car, but utilizes the ratchet type assembly to operate while laying horizontally on the ground. The jack has two large pads that support it on the ground and make it very stable. The jack is perfect for the Corvair including the

truck, but requires a small modification to use on the Corvair. The pad that contacts the body crossmember is a large six inch pad with a bump in the middle to fit into the frame of the Chevelle. Since this will not fit the Corvair crossmember, modification is necessary and easily done. The change will require having some kind of pad put on the original lifting pad on the jack, or just exchanging the two, one for the other. The new pad could be made by someone with welding equipment or you could make one yourself by

bolting one on. This jack requires only six pumps to put a Chevelle in the air high enough, so it will be more than adequate for a Corvair. It is longer and wider than the original jack so it will have to be stored in the trunk. The benefit however, will more than compensate for the space it takes up. The place to acquire one would be a wrecking yard, as they often buy a smashed car for parts, and the same for body shops. I think the dealers will want more than the jack is worth so that source is not economical.

# Your gear oil . . . keep it clean

The 1961 Corvair Shop Manual specifies that gear oil in the transaxle should be changed every 10,000 miles. How many of us bother?

1964-69 transaxles don't even have drain plugs, so who likes to rent a crane just to change gear oil? Most transaxles I open up have metal-flake oil and a slimy coating everywhere inside. Probably most still have the original factory oil.

To help reduce the metal-flake effect between

10,000 mile oil changes use a magnetic drain plug (on '64-'69, drill and tap for drain plug when you are rebuilding).

Obtain a strong magnet  $\frac{1}{2}$  diameter  $\times \frac{3}{4}$ " length. Drill a  $31/32$ " hole, the  $1/2$ " hole in drain plug (using two steps improves accuracy of finished hole). Stake magnet in place in hole. When you remove the plug to change the oil the steel particles will all be on the magnet. Clean off the magnet and reinstall the plug.



## GM offers gas additive

In a Chevrolet dealer service bulletin dated May, 1988, General Motors has announced the availability of a gasoline additive for preventing exhaust valve recession in some cars and trucks.

Called GM Anti-Valve-Recession Additive and designated part number 12345492, the product is intended for use in GM cars and trucks built prior to the 1971 model year. These vehicles have engines which were designed to use leaded gasoline and may experience exhaust valve recession if

operated at high speeds and loads with unleaded gasoline. The same applies to certain trucks built for model years 1971 through 1986.

The recommended dosage is one container per tankful (20 gallons) of unleaded gasoline, which should provide valve protection equivalent to leaded gasoline with a lead concentration of 0.1 grams per gallon.

# TECH SESSION:

**PAINT PEOPLE or People Who Paint:** There's good news for those of you who admired the paintwork on my two cars. Leo Martinez, the man who did them is again available to put on those lovely Corvair colors. Or IMRON, if you're of that bent! Besides that, he and his son Steve can detail your car much better than most of us are willing to. If you're like me, you'd rather drive than fuss; money is the insulator that protects us from jobs we don't want to do. Anyhow, call me and I'll get you in touch.

**CORVAIRS and the CONTACT LENS:** My eye doc told me to try contact lenses, hinting I'd not need glasses again. Lies! Not only do I need reading glasses (I'm old, dammit) but the lenses make for light sensitivity. I use dark glasses, too. Since Mom watches MAGNUM on tv, she suggested I, like he, keep one pair of glasses hung round my neck. I guess I'll have to watch the show, because I can't figure out how to keep the shoulder belt free tangling the glasses and neckstrap. Tom Selleck DOES strap himself into his Ferrari, doesn't he? Unless I'm careful and undo the snarl before leaving the car, I catch myself on the way to a whiplash. I think this section's misnamed; it's not the contact lenses at fault; it's really the blinkin' glasses...

**SEARS OIL:** I bought for cheap, 2 dozen quarts of SEARS 10-40 oil in white bottles. As I poured it in, I found a fine black precipitate. I used the oil anyway. Don't! This oil tends to clog things up, lifters-wise. Since oil, like gasoline, is hard to return for refunds, the best policy is to stay with brands who have their own names on the oil. Who knows where Sears got their stuff? From Uncle Sluggo's Midnite Air Freight, I bet...

**HOLD TIGHT, but not too tight:** Corvairs, like most cars have lots of fasteners which can't be torqued. In addition, many are screws driven directly into thin metal which is getting worn by now. While damaged speednuts can be replaced, worn holes can't easily be fixed. You could use a larger screw which looks wrong. You could ignore the loose screw. One idea that works in these low strength locations is just to use a little weatherstrip cement under the head, at the stripped hole or both. Use a compatible color, light brown or black. As with Brylcreem, "a little dab'll do ya," although less is best. Use the least cement that will keep the screw in its hole and the component from falling off. Tighten the screw very gently; when in doubt, better a little loose than too tight. You want to preserve as much of the almost stripped hole as possible. Use too much cement and you may be sorry if you ever want to remove that screw!

**TRUNK LID, ENGINE LID:** It amazes me how many ill fitting lids Corvairists put up with. Unless there's been badly repaired collision damage, there's just no excuse for a lid that rattles while you ride. Got a too

tight lid that you must drop hard, threatening the license lamp bulb? Must you push hard on the trunklid, bending sheetmetal and abrading paint? Adjust those offending parts! Earlies have the latch (the moving part) in the engine lid. All other latches are in the body. In either case, loosen the strike (the non-moving part) and move it so the latch meets it without scraping on either side; just try it for fit and don't close completely. If you like, make pencil marks so you don't lose the lateral adjustment. The lid's tightness is controlled by how deep into the body the strike is moved, so your next step is to move the strike closer or farther from the latch. Do this in small 1/16" steps and tighten it each time. Close the lid and try, try again. You'll quickly find a position that's better than what you had, maybe even better than Chevy's original adjustment. If you're ambitious, clean and lube the latch and hinges.

**RADIO SPEAKERS:** If you replace an original speaker with some other style, cover its frame and cone with nylon to keep small objects from falling onto the cone and buzzing while you listen. GM used black cotton, but your handiest source is used pantyhose and black is the best color. You'll need to stretch and then cement it. It's a nuisance to remove small stones, etc., from an unprotected cone. Incidentally, any original grillcloth has long gone brittle. It can tear, fall against the speaker cone and buzz. You can remove what's loose by a combination of fishing with bent wire and vacuuming with a piece of small hose taped to a regular household vacuum. The vacuum will work for stuff that's fallen onto an unbroken grille, too. There's also the glob-of-rubber-cement trick but it's a messy last resort.

You're best off if you manage to keep small objects away from the radio portion of the grille; the sides don't matter. If you must vacuum around an unbroken grille cloth, it's best not to use the brush. If you want to change speakers, see my earlier columns.

**TIRES:** The modern tire typically wears most at center tread, so 18 pounds front and 29 pounds rear are not too low. I recommend more but that won't change the wear characteristics. Assuming you keep your pitmen are pin in good order and get an occasional wheel alignment, any other wear like scalloping is due to shock absorber or wheel balance. Uneven wear in the rear is due to worn bushings or shock absorbers. Lates should look at the strut and bushing under the transaxle. All should check tires for out-of-round. Remember that shocks can only be checked by dismounting the bottom bolts and working the shock, comparing its resistance to its mate on the same end of the car.

# Nader couldn't kill the Corvair

## Fans swear by GM rear-engined car that was ahead of its time

MODESTO — Chevrolet abandoned the Corvair in 1969, but loyal followers of the rear-engined compact refuse to let it die.

Many Corvair enthusiasts use their 1960-69 vintage Corvairs as everyday transportation. Some even enter their cars in auto shows and even driving competition events.

Modesto postal carrier Steve Lovejoy, a longtime Corvair fan, said there are many reasons why the air-cooled Corvair has such a large following.

"They don't look old, they're a little different, and they're fun to drive," said Lovejoy. "They get pretty good gas mileage and compared to today's cars they're easy to work on."

The Corvair also was ahead of its time, with innovations that are now just becoming popular with the general motoring public:

• **Body style.** Corvairs have the smooth and rounded aerodynamic lines now popular with cars such as the Ford Taurus.

• **Turbocharged engine.** Corvair pioneered the exhaust-driven supercharger in 1962. Turbos are now available on numerous makes, including nearly all Chrysler models.

• **Mini-van and mini-pickup.** The Corvair lineup included a mini-van and small pickup, years ahead of the successful Chrysler mini-van and Japanese pickups.

• **Sports coupe.** The 1962 Corvair Monza with bucket seats and a four-

speed stick shift was one of the first sporty coupes.

Lovejoy, 40, has been a Corvair owner since 1964. In 1981, he said he realized parts could soon be getting hard to find for his trio of Corvairs and it might be time to move on to a more modern car.

After purchasing a series of three new cars — including a pair of Japanese sport coupes — Lovejoy returned to the Corvair fold.

"I've owned three new cars and those cars have given me more trouble," he said. "The Corvair handles better — crisper — and is more fun to drive."

A Massachusetts firm specializing in parts for the discontinued model has proven the savior to Corvair owners like Lovejoy.

"Clark's Corvair Co. in Massachusetts is growing and growing," said Lovejoy. "They have a large inventory and they're going to be around a long time."

The radical Corvair debuted in 1960 as an Americanized version of the Volkswagen Beetle. The Corvair was lauded as a family-size econo-

and four-wheel-independent suspension.

Initial year Corvair sales topped 250,000 units. Sales of the General Motors economy car peaked in 1962 at 292,531. While 1965 sales were a healthy 235,528, Corvair sales began their slide, dropping to 103,743 in 1966, 27,253 in '67, 15,399 in '68 and just 6,000 in '69.

Some industry observers believe the Corvair's downfall was due to the book "Unsafe at any Speed," by consumer advocate Ralph Nader. Nader criticized the handling characteristics of the rear-engine Corvair in his book.

While General Motors never lost a Corvair lawsuit and the car's handling improved in later years, the damage was already done.

Modestan Frank Dotson, a retired bank manager and secretary-treasurer of the local Central Valley Corvairs car club, downplays Nader's significance in Corvair history. "General Motors was already backing out of it," said Dotson about the Corvair demise.

GM could afford to back out of

the Corvair because it countered with the Camaro in 1967, a "pony car" in the mold of the highly successful Ford Mustang.

However, Corvair fans rallied around their fallen automobile. A national club — the Corvair Society of America — was formed in 1969 and now boasts a membership of about 7,000.

The Sports Car Club of America has recognized the popularity of the Corvair with special all-Corvair classes in concours d'elegance show competitions.

Corvairs also are competed in SCCA road races. Doug Hargrove of Modesto has raced a Corvair since 1967 and has many top finishes and overall wins to his credit. SCCA this year also has accepted Corvairs in its growing International Touring division.

Corvairs also are legitimate special-interest automobiles that are appreciating in value. "I think what makes them attractive as a collector car is you can get into them cheap," said Dotson.

Dotson estimates a clean, early model Corvair can be purchased for about \$900. Even a desirable convertible can be had for about \$3,000, with a concours-quality car bringing up to \$6,000.

While the cars don't go down in value, Dotson said fiscal appreciation is not the reason for buying a Corvair. "Basically, you do it for love," said Dotson. "You have to love the car."





# Know what to do if car suddenly breaks down

No matter where a car breaks down, whether it be in rush hour traffic on the freeway or in front of the owner's home, it almost always brings on stress — a real feeling of panic.

Dale Koop, vice president of engineering at Hastings Manufacturing Company, says, "Problems are rarely serious in those unexpected road breakdowns, and a systematic approach to diagnosing the problem can get drivers back on the road with a minimum loss of time and money.

"The key is to get to know your own car, how it drives, and how the engine sounds."

At the first sign of car trouble, Koop advises motorists to move slowly toward the right-hand shoulder of the road. If the car dies in traffic, don't try to push it across lanes of speeding cars. This could cause a serious accident on a freeway jammed with fast-moving vehicles.

In that case, says Koop, it would be better to wait patiently for a police officer to stop traffic long enough to get the car to the right shoulder.

Once the car is safely off the

road and emergency blinkers and/or safety flares are set, the driver can begin to locate the problem.

A car runs on air, fuel and fire or combustion. If it's not up and running, chances are the car's being deprived of one or more of its "essential elements."

Below is a list of common symptoms and checks that will help diagnose most auto problems:

\* The engine/temperature light goes on: This signals engine overheating. It could be caused by a leak in one of the hoses.

When the engine cools, check the hoses and tape up any leaks. The car could also be low on coolant. After the radiator cools, check the fluid level and add water with the engine running.

A loose or broken fan belt could also cause overheating. Finally, check the fan. If it is not spinning properly, it could be the source of the overheating problem.

Try starting the car again. If the light is off, drive slowly to a filling station. If it is still on, do not drive the car any further. Call for help.

\* The oil light goes on: If the gauge is working properly, this means the car's lost oil pressure and possibly oil. Check the dipstick.

If no oil shows, add oil before driving again. If the oil level shows full and the warning light remains on, don't drive the car. Tow it to the nearest station to avoid major engine damage.

A flickering oil light could just mean the engine's idling too slowly or the oil's getting low or thin.

Drive to the nearest filling station and have the car checked.

\* The engine dies while driving: If the car's not out of gas, it could have a vapor lock. Vapor lock occurs when the gas gets so hot it boils in the fuel line — very possible in stop and go traffic on hot days. The bubbles caused by boiling keep fuel from flowing to the carburetor.

If this occurs, just sit tight. The car should start again after the engine cools. If the car's just been driven through high water, the ignition wires could be wet. Use a rag to dry off the wiring. A clogged air filter or broken hose or belt could also stop a car dead in traffic.

It's good to carry extra hoses and fan belts, in addition to a good lubricant, for just such emergencies.

"But regular, preventative maintenance," says Koop, "is the best way to avoid engine hassle and keep a car on the road."
